

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Hillview Water Company – Raymond Has Levels of Arsenic and Uranium Above the Drinking Water Standard

Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what you should do, what happened, and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Water samples collected on November 6, 2018 showed arsenic levels of 17 µg/L for Well No. 11. Compliance with the arsenic maximum contaminant level (MCL) is based on a running annual average (RAA) of four quarterly samples. Testing results from the past year result in an RAA of 22 µg/L, which exceeds the arsenic MCL of 10 µg/L.

Water samples collected on November 6, 2018 showed uranium levels of 8.7 pCi/L for Well 10 and 52 pCi/L for Well 11. Compliance with the uranium MCL is based on an RAA of four quarterly samples. Testing results from the past year result in an RAA of 28.2 pCi/L for Well 10 and 46.3 pCi/L for Well 11. Water produced from Raymond Wells 10 and 11 exceed the uranium MCL of 20 pCi/L.

What should I do?

- **You do not need to use an alternative water supply (e.g., bottled water).**
- This is not an emergency. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. However, *some people who drink water containing arsenic in excess of the MCL over many years may experience skin damage or circulatory system problems, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer and some people who drink water containing uranium in excess of the MCL over many years may have kidney problems or an increased risk of getting cancer.*
- If you have other health issues concerning the consumption of this water, you may wish to consult your doctor.

What happened? What is being done?

We have wells that do not meet the MCL for arsenic and uranium. The arsenic and uranium problem will be resolved by treatment and from two additional new wells we will build as part of four Raymond grant projects we have received which total some \$6,327,896. The Proposition 50 and two Proposition 84 grant projects to improve the quantity and quality of the Raymond water supply are nearly complete. The grants allowed us to build treatment plants that bring the water to below the arsenic and uranium MCL levels. These treatment plants are scheduled to be complete by January 31, 2019. All preliminary testing has produced completely compliant and healthy water.

Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this public notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.

Secondary Notification Requirements

Upon receipt of notification from a person operating a public water system, the following notification must be given within 10 days [Health and Safety Code Section 116450(g)]:

- SCHOOLS: Must notify school employees, students, and parents (if the students are minors).
- RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTY OWNERS OR MANAGERS (including nursing homes and care facilities): Must notify tenants.
- BUSINESS PROPERTY OWNERS, MANAGERS, OR OPERATORS: Must notify employees of businesses located on the property.

To bring the Raymond water system to the point of meeting the arsenic and uranium standards, the Hillview Water Company has received Proposition 50 and 84 grants totaling some \$6,327,896 to construct a water treatment plant to remove excess contaminants.

Tasks completed in the reporting quarter:

Completed testing for operation of plant. Demolished old tanks. Installed new water tank. Finished grading and put all new boosters online.

Tasks remaining to complete:


Permitting and treatment plant certification. Horse Canyon Road pipe connection. Pour entry driveway. Pour onsite driveway. Pour drainage curbing. Site fencing. Fence gate installation. Paving.
